## Breeding Terms and Conditions:

The breeding season begins on February 20, 2025, and ends on June 30, 2025.

1. The stud fee is due upon signing the contract.
2. If registration is completed by October 30, 2024, an early booking discount of €150 will be granted (only with a signed breeding contract).
3. The mare's boarding fee is €20/day for mares without foals and €25/day for mares with foals at foot. This fee is due at the latest upon the mare's departure.
4. The mare must be healthy and in good condition. The mare owner guarantees that the mare will arrive free of infectious diseases
  - a) A current and clear swab test must be provided (also for mares with foals at foot who are not being bred during foal heat and for maiden mares). The swab test must not be older than 4 weeks.
  - b) The mare owner must provide proof of vaccination against influenza, tetanus, and herpesvirus. The horse passport and a copy of the pedigree must be handed over upon the mare's arrival.
  - c) The mare must not have hind shoes on for breeding. If this is the case, the stallion owner reserves the right to have them removed by a farrier at the mare owner's expense.
  - d) The mare owner must provide proof of an existing liability insurance for the mare.
5. The stallion owner reserves the right to reject the following mares and, if necessary, have them transported back to the owner at their expense:
  - a) Mares showing symptoms of infectious diseases.
  - b) Mares that are not receptive to breeding despite the use of usual aids (breeding ropes, nose twitch).
  - c) Mares with poor or dangerous behavior.
  - d) Mares that do not meet one or more of the conditions listed under point 4.
6. The stallion owner grants a live foal guarantee. This applies if:
  - a) The mare does not conceive.
  - b) The mare absorbs or has a stillbirth.
  - c) If the foal dies within 24 hours of birth, the live foal guarantee also applies. If the foal dies after 24 hours, the live foal guarantee is void.
  - d) The guarantee is limited to the mare mentioned above.
  - e) If the mare is sold, the live foal guarantee also expires.
  - f) If any of these conditions occur, the stallion owner must be notified immediately, and in the case of a miscarriage or foal death, a veterinary confirmation must be provided within 48 hours.
7. A re-breeding is only possible in the current breeding season (until July 30 of the year) and in the following breeding season. No stud fee will be charged for the re-breeding in the following year.
8. There is no guarantee that the stallion will be stationed at the same stud in the following year.
9. The stallion owner reserves the right to have the mare monitored or treated by a veterinarian at the mare owner's expense. The mare owner also agrees to cover any other costs that may arise, such as farrier services.
10. The stallion owner agrees to treat the mare with the utmost care and ensure appropriate breeding.
11. If the stallion dies, the stud fee will be refunded if no further services can be provided (natural cover and frozen semen).
12. Upon successful breeding and once all invoices have been settled, the stallion owner will issue a breeding certificate to the mare owner.
13. The stallion owner and staff are not liable for any accidents or disasters that may occur to the mare or mare with foal during their stay at the stud. It is recommended that the mare (and foal) be insured if necessary.
